KING OF FRUITS

Honey Mango, Mandarin, Mango Rum

Back in the 19th century, Mirza Ghalib immortalised the honey mango in his beautiful verses, describing it as the 'King of Fruits'.

Ghalib was a celebrated poet of his time; his writings were often repurposed in Indian films and were particularly favoured by lovers of Persian and Urdu.

While the poet carried huge sadness inside him (after losing seven children), Ghalib remained the greatest source of inspiration for many. His poems taught people to look for gratitude even in the smallest of things.

And so, it comes as no surprise, that since Ghalib's penmanship about the honey mango - or more accurately known as the 'chaunsa' - the fruit has been reigning Pakistani Punjab, with pride.

Till this day, many believe that the lips that touch the famous King of Fruits, will be promised a royal experience, like no other. Take a sip of this luminously orange concoction and the rewards may be fruitful, in more ways than one.





DJIN OF NIGHT

Orange, Elderflower, Jasmine, Black Mulberry
and Persian Black Lemon Gin

Immerse yourself in original Persian flavours and aromas with Jasmine, Black Mulberry and Persian Black Lemon Gin.

As the sun rises on the Persian Gulf, you gaze out to the calm, turquoise sea and sense a citrus woody scent.

Persian Black Lemon originates from Loomi limes which are grown in the Persian Gulf region and are widely used in the local cuisine. Today, they are grown in the Mediterranean as well as South Asia.

In equal harmony, Black Mulberry and Jasmine add a refreshing touch of sweetness from the region with roots in ancient Persia, specifically the area between Iran and Afghanistan. They have since been cultivated and naturalised globally.

Sweet Coconut, Lime Zest, Pistachio Rum



The parade was a show of strength and appreciation, as stunningly captured in this cocktail.

Imagine sticky coconut, alongside the creamy crunch of pistachio nuts - all while having the zest of fresh lime, cutting through. Infinite perfection, and a sight to behold! Thank you, Istanbul.





CHAMPAGNE LASSI

Alphonso Mango, Roasted Coconut, Champagne

The marriage of sweet alphonso mango and creamy roasted coconut, is what gives this signature cocktail, undisputed depth. Visually, it is a classic lassi, dressed in the most exquisite clothing!

Ancient Indian folklore tells us that the coconut palm is a gift from the God of Eels. He who promised to remain by Tanaiya - a young girl's side, forever. The God advised Tanaiya, that after he would transform himself to an eel, she would need to axe his head and bury it near her hut. Only then, would Tanaiya enjoy the gift of a lifetime.

Alas, Tanaiya did as the God had asked. Soon, the spot where she had buried the eel's head, transformed into a magnificent coconut tree! It swayed and sang beautifully, and offered the sweetest milky water.

Paired with the delicate bubbles of French champagne, ripened mango, and coconut-flavoured kulfi, this cocktail too, will give you an experience of a lifetime.





FLOWERS OF HAFEZ

Red Roses, Poppies, Pomegranate Flowers,
Jasmine Gin

Master of poetic metaphors, was Hafez. A fourteenth century Persian poet who wrote 'ghazals' (lyrics) about ecstasy, faith, and love of both the carnal and spiritual kind.

The rose (and its simple intricacies) was the focal point of many of Hafez's writings. Literary masterpieces such as 'How did the rose ever open its heart?' remain popular phrases in Persian culture; and continue to soften even the toughest of exteriors.

It is claimed that even Oscar Wilde collected the works of Hafez in his prison library, and that the poet's famous words ultimately inspired Wilde's story of 'The Rose and the Nightingale'. Such was the remarkability of Hafez, he would leave a lasting impact on everybody he would cross paths with!

To honour Hafez's most prominent work, rose has been placed as the main attraction of this cocktail.

Complementing its floral flavours is of course poppy, jasmine, and delicate pomegranate flowers.

Relax. Exhale - as we walk you through the Persian garden of Shiraz.

For it is a time of new beginnings. The "solar equinox" to be precise; when the sun crosses the earth's equator, and day and night are of equal length.


This festival of "Nowruz" calls for the finest.

As you snuggle up around the campfire on a starry night in Balochistan, gazing into the light and the stars, you ponder on the meaning of life.




Perhaps time spent in nature amongst good humans and away from the hustle and bustle of the city is a humbling opportunity for reflection.

The rising heat of India is showing no respite.


In an effort to cool yourself, you have eaten half a dozen cubes of fresh mango. Its sweet juice has helped somewhat; but a stronger remedy is needed.

PALOUDEH

Rose, Mint, Persian Tea, Cantaloupe, Green Spot Single Pot Still

You are clenching onto a handful of ice; the cold sensation against your skin is giving you relief like no other.

There is a sweet scent enveloping you now, you follow it excitedly and arrive at a fruit stall - which seems more of a shrine to cantaloupe melons.




There is no better place to sit with your thoughts, than in this forest. The trees tend to speak the same language as you.

Rabia was born into a male-dominated 'cocoon' of a world. She followed the light of a higher deity her entire life, until she too was able to spread her wings like a scintillating butterfly and become free! Her inner beauty and spiritual evolution has strengthened the role of women in Sufi culture, for centuries.

Made with non-alcoholic gin, sharp lemon juice, cane sugar and the floral notes of butterfly pea tea, Beauty and the Butterfly pays homage to Qavali's philosophy of evolution (as inspired by Rabia and Sufism); and how without it, we simply cease to exist.

SCARLET

A tribute to one of the first colours used by artists - dating back to prehistory.


Ranging from orange tinges to deep wine hues, the shade of red has held extraordinary significance for societies around the world. It is celebrated in history and ancient folklores; often symbolic for energy, life, bravery, and passion.

Serendipitously, the ingredients which carve the very culture of Iran are too, red.

We take inspiration from this in Scarlet; and capture the flushness of red roses as well as the vivacity of pomegranate flesh. One is a national flower; and the other a firm favourite, in both Persian food and drink.

If there was a drink of paradise for artists (and creatives alike), indeed, Scarlet would be it.

This non-alcoholic cocktail is perfumed with dry cranberry and further adorned by floral jasmynes. Many say, that its sight is akin to a 'lady in red'. Why not take a sip; and see if it seduces you....





AKBAR & ALPHONSO

Smashed Mango, Lemongrass, Fresh Lemon,
Root Ginger



An ode to Akbar, the Great. Indeed, the greatest Mughal Emperor, who reigned from 1556 to 1605 across the Indian subcontinent.

According to ancient history, the Emperor planted a garden of 100,000 mango trees in Lakhi Bagh, Bihar. The most improved versions of this fruit in India is said to relate to that time, with the Alphonso mango being known as the sweetest and juiciest of them all.

The mango itself is joyfully favoured in Indian culture. Several references are made to it in Sanskrit; and many South Asian poets celebrate it, in their writings.

This rich blend of alphonso mango, with lemongrass, ginger, and zingy fresh lemon is reminiscent of the centuries of adoration towards a staple fruit. Enjoy, with gratitude.





MIRACLE OF MADANA

Fresh Mango, Coconut Ice-Cream, Damiana

In ancient Indian mythology, Kamadeva - also known as Madana - is the God of love. He is portrayed as a handsome man, armed with flower-tipped arrows.

Of all his efflorescent arrows, Madana uses the mango blossom to evoke sensual desire among women. It is believed that Sanskrit literature takes light of this, as it is awash with romanticised descriptions of the mango blossom. One of the most famous describes the blossom as 'being ecstatically pecked at by birds'.

Even today, the mango fruit remains a symbol of love, fertility and prosperity in India.

And so, inspired by the passion of Madana, Qavali takes the ripe sweetness of mango and pairs it tenderly with coconut ice-cream and the herbal notes of Damiana liqueur. The beverage is delicately garnished with coconut chips and edible flowers; and is sure to stir feelings of sensuality within you, too.





QAVALI SHARBAT

Fresh Lemon, Lime Zest, Sweet Cardamom,
Pandan

£7.00

The oldest mention of sharbat is found in a Persian book of the 12th century, Zakhireye Khwarazmshahi. In this medical encyclopaedia, the author Ismail Gorgani described the varieties of sharbat of that time; including anar, ghoor, and Sekanjebin.

Since then, the reason for sharbat's wide popularity was because till the early 20th century, there were few means of preserving and transporting fresh fruit. Refrigeration was only available for the wealthy; and thus, fruits remained seasonal and local, except for when they could be reduced to a liquid essence in the form of a syrup.

Traditionally made from fruit juices or extracts of flowers and herbs, sherbet has been reinvented (in the most riveting ways!) in Islamic culture and dining. Our house version is renowned throughout the Qavali sphere of influence.

Intense, crisp, and delightfully refreshing, Qavali Sharbat is concocted with kewra water for dryness, alongside minty cardamom and bright citrus fruits.





PARADISE GARDEN

Sweet Lychee, Golden Grapefruit, Rose





Lowlands whiskies come highly recommended if you enjoy flavours that are less peaty and robust.

Speyside whiskies are known for their floral, sweet and light caramel flavour profiles - and on occasion, can exhibit pronounced smokey characteristics, too. Fascinatingly, Speyside plays host to over half the distilleries in Scotland; and has the greatest concentration of malt whisky producers compared to any other whisky-producing region. Because of this, you can expect a vast array of whiskies distilled in Speyside - and find one that suits your palate, sublimely.



ISLAY

Usually associated with peaty single malt whisky, Islay whiskies are widely favoured for their pungent, smoky, and robust flavours - with just the perfect hint of salty sea air (divine!). Islay single malt whisky must be produced at a single distillery, from nothing other than yeast, water and malted barley - before being distilled in pot stills and matured for a minimum of three years, including a full day in oak casks. Perfection takes time, after all.



HIGHLAND

Single Malt Scotch whisky from the Highlands cannot possibly be summarised in just a few short adjectives. The region is vast; and so comprises of a number of flavour profiles and characteristics. Typically, single malt from the Highlands is categorised into four subregions, named after the geographical compass points. To the north, there are big bodied single malts, with cereal sweetness and richness. Lighter, fruitier whiskies with a dryness are found toward the south. To the east, there are full-bodied dry whiskies with plenty of fruit and pungency. And the Western Highlands offer full body with peaty, smoky undertones. Finally, nearer the coast, more maritime flavoured whiskies are commonly found.

Due to the island’s close vicinity to the sea, the whiskies from these regions offer a slight salinity (a real stand-out characteristic for many). However, you can expect to enjoy numerous flavour profiles and notes.

CAMPBELTOWN

Idyllically perched on the Mull of Kintyre, Campbeltown is a region that is renowned for its slight coastal character. The whiskies are enjoyed for their dryness and pungency, often with hints of salt, smoke, vanilla and toffee mingle. As it happens, Campbeltown was once one of the most prolific regions in Scotland, until the US prohibition affected the area - leaving just two main distilleries producing whisky (to date). Regardless of its history, the region continues to promise robust flavour profiles, like no other.

IRISH

As such, Irish whiskies are thought to be smooth and fruity - and many, triple distilled. These whiskies are most recommended for those who are looking for something easy to drink.



AMERICAN

American whiskies make generous use of new charred oak (prevalent in most styles of US whisky; and used exclusively in the production of Bourbon) - and this lends to its stunning sweet flavours; as well as dominant notes of vanilla, caramel, and tannins. Rye is the flavour grain in most bourbons and American rye whisky, resulting in spicier flavours with lots of complexity. For those who enjoy Tennessee whiskies, these are essentially bourbons which undergo the "Lincoln Country Process", developed by the iconic Jack Daniels. This involves filtering the spirit through super maple charcoal - allowing for a more mellow drinking experience.




